With everything parents have to juggle these days, the time may come when families have to leave a child home alone. There are a number of important things to consider before allowing your child to stay home without you. **Make sure your child knows...** His or her full name, address and telephone number along with your full name and how to reach you. He or she should never open the door for someone unless that person is on a preapproved list of trusted adults you have provided. **You should....** Assess your child. Make sure that they are mature enough to handle this responsibility. Ask them about how they feel about being alone. Keep a list of numbers close to the telephone including those for you, other trusted adults, 911 and other emergency services. Create practice situations and be sure your child understands what to do in specific emergencies such as a fire or loss of electricity. Make sure they carry the key and be sure it is secure. They need to lock the door after entering and make sure the home is secure. Tell callers you're unavailable instead of saying he or she is home alone. They need to call you when they have arrived safely home.
